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Where to find... wine holidays in unusual places

Said to be the birthplace of the grapevine, **Georgia** produces 520 native grape varieties. The eight-night "Cradle of Wine" tour takes in some of the country's best wineries (5-13 Sept, £3,095pp, including flights and meals; www.winetours.co.uk).

Nashik, a region northeast of Mumbai, India, is now home to a number of good boutique vineyards. This week-long tour includes a trip to the Sula vineyard, where Nashik's "wine boom" began (from £1,499 including flights; www.greavesindia.co.uk).

Sample a range of "delicious" wines on an eight-night trip to **Virginia**, where you'll also visit Monticello, ancestral home of the "wine-loving" former president Thomas Jefferson (25 Oct-1 Nov, from £1,799, with some meals; www.goodwinetours.com).

Burma has a "budding" wine industry. On a 12-night tour of the country, you'll visit two wineries including Aythaya, said to produce the best grappa outside Italy (from £2,995, with flights; www.steppestravel.com).
